A motion was made by Marci Edwards, seconded by Donna Arndt to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented. Motion carried.

President's Report:

1. Jim reported that one more drawing class is scheduled at the library for November 15th from 1-3 PM. Let him know if you are available to teach it.
2. The new Jackson Creek Senior Center is still being considered as a place to display PLAG art. Jim and Don Goodman will visit to explore the possible space.
3. The Senior Center does want to offer art classes to its residents. Contact them directly if you are interested in teaching.

Committee Reports:

1. **The Winter Show:** Margarete Seagraves announced that entry forms can be printed from the PLAG website. The deadline is Jan. 19th 2019. The show runs from Jan. 29th - February 23rd. The Opening Reception is February 1st.
2. **Nominating Committee:** Open positions are for Publicity Chairperson and Treasurer.

Gallery Committee:

1. The committee is still seeking artists to do workshops for members following our meetings.
2. The January meeting and hands-on workshop on acrylic pouring will be held at Irmi Knoth's studio. On February 5 (with Feb. 12 snow date) there is a Meet and Greet at Irmi's home. Wilma Steenbergen will present a demonstration on paper making after the March meeting. April is still open. It is still hoped that Carrie and David Jones will present at the May meeting. June is temporarily scheduled for another Meet and Greet and July will be the annual picnic. Times and directions for all activities will be given in advance.
3. Following confirmation from Nancy Moglin concerning the purpose of the funds donated in memory of Judy Wood, the Gallery Committee decided to offer it as prize money for the June show.
4. A motion was made by Susie Arnold, seconded by Claudia Dimidik, to put \$250 from the Craft Show proceeds into the Scholarship fund bringing the total to \$3,000 with the remainder of the proceeds to be placed in the general fund to cover expenses. Motion carried.
